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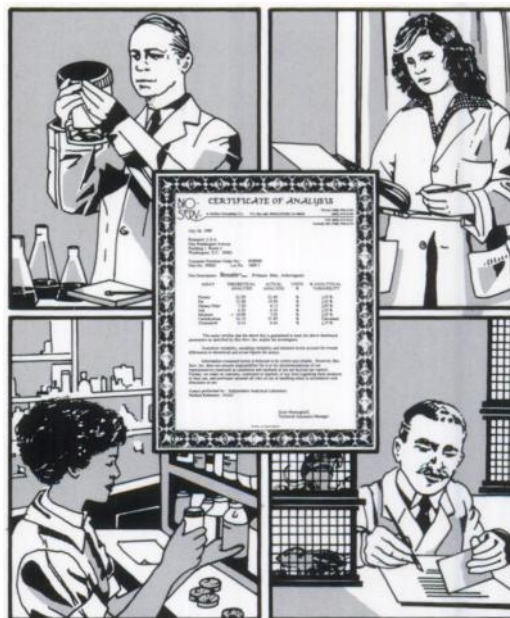
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**NSERC-INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH CHAIR IN NUTRITIONAL TOXICOLOGY**  
Department of Nutritional Sciences, Faculty of Medicine

Applications are invited for an NSERC-Industrial Research Chair in Nutritional Toxicology to be held in the newly established University-Industry Program in Food Safety, Nutrition and Regulatory Affairs in the Department of Nutritional Sciences. This is a tenure track position at the level of Associate or Full Professor.

The chairholder will be expected to develop and lead a research program in nutritional toxicology/food safety. Funding for the position includes research support over the term of the appointment. The chairholder will be expected to augment this with external funding. He/she will be expected to apply molecular biological techniques to examine fundamental mechanisms of nutrient interactions at the cellular level. The research will have relevance for regulatory decisions and nutrition advice to the public. The chairholder will be expected to establish linkages with colleagues in this and other

departments in the University, develop liaisons with the food industry and provide general leadership in the area of food safety and nutrition. Teaching in undergraduate and graduate courses offered by the Department and graduate student supervision will also be expected.

Applicants should have a PhD or MD degree with specialized expertise preferably in food safety and toxicology supported by a record of refereed publications.
