#### American Institute of Nutrition Awards

The American Institute of Nutrition, with financial support from a group of corporations and foundations, annually provides six prestigious awards that recognize superior achievement in nutrition research and public service:

- *The Bio-Serv Award in Experimental Animal Nutrition*, sponsored by Bio-Serv, Inc., for meritorious research in nutrition by an investigator who received the doctoral degree in the ten years preceding the month the award is presented.
- *The Osborne and Mendel Award*, sponsored by International Life Sciences Institute-Nutrition Foundation, for outstanding recent basic research accomplishments in nutrition.
- *The Borden Award in Nutrition*, sponsored by Borden Inc., for distinctive research, by investigators in the U.S. and Canada, on the nutritional significance of any food or food component.
- *The Conrad A. Elvehjem Award for Public Service in Nutrition*, sponsored by Nabisco Brands, for specific and distinguished service to the public through the science of nutrition.
- *The Mead Johnson Award*, sponsored by Mead Johnson Nutritionals, for a single outstanding piece of recent research in nutrition or a series of recent papers on the same subject by an investigator who is under 40 years of age at the time the award is presented.
- *The Lederle Award in Human Nutrition*, sponsored by Lederle Laboratories, for recent investigative contributions of contemporary significance to the understanding of human nutrition.

The deadline for receipt of nominations is **September 1, 1994**.

#### American Institute of Nutrition Fellows

Scientists who have had distinguished careers in nutrition and are at least sixty-five years of age are eligible for nomination as Fellows of the American Institute of Nutrition. Membership in the Institute is not a requirement. The deadline for receipt of nominations is **October 1, 1994**.

#### The E.V. McCollum International Lectureship in Nutrition

This Lectureship provides a means of encouraging sound advancements in nutritional science and their application in improving the health and well-being of people worldwide and to commemorate the life and contributions of E.V. McCollum. An outstanding nutritionist will be invited to lecture on a topic and in a location which will provide broad coverage of a subject that will promote the purpose of the Lectureship. The deadline for receipt of nominations is **October 1, 1994**.
