To upload the form:

1. Print out the Change in Authorship Form (all three pages)
2. Have all authors sign the form
3. Scan all **three** pages of the completed and signed form as well as any letters from authors and save as a PDF file
4. Go to *The Journal of Nutrition* Manuscript Processing System:

5. Enter the Author Area
6. Locate your manuscript in the queue and select the "Upload Copyright Form" link. Upload the entire PDF file.

- a. Patent and trademark rights to any process or procedure described in the article
- b. The right to photocopy or make single electronic copies of the article for their own personal use, including for their own classroom use, or for the personal use of colleagues, provided the copies are not offered for sale and are not distributed in a systematic way outside of their employing institution (e.g. via an email list or public file server). Posting of the article on a secure network (not accessible to the public) within the author's institution is permitted.

Regardless of whether the un-copyedited version or the copyedited, final version of the manuscript is submitted to the NIH, the PI must abide by the *JN* policy of making articles free online on our website as well as in the NIH repository 12 months after publication. This will satisfy both the *JN* and NIH policies.
